Throughout its existence, during all times, the Union has been uniting the most famous and distinctive, the most interesting and well-known, the most readable and popular Belarusan writers who are citizens of the country which destiny means a lot to them. These traditions established by predecessors are continued today by us. The work with creative people, each of whom is a Personality, requires a special responsibility from us. Therefore, the Union's activity has recently become so wide and all-encompassing. Publishing, protection of creators' rights, work with youth, gender subjects, organization of events and actions, meetings with readers, etc. have become our everyday work. Although we have to work in difficult conditions, with no state support, we try to pay maximum attention to our members and to direct all our activity to the good of Belarusan literature and language which are the basis of the existence of the Belarusan nation and the country called Belarus.

ABOUT US: THE PAST AND THE PRESENT

The Union of Belarusan Writers is the oldest creative organization of the country; it was founded in 1934. The UBW members were the classics of national literature: Janka Kupala, Jakub Kolas, Kuzma Corny, Kandrat Krapiva, Michas Lynkou, Piatrus Brouka, Arkadz Kulasou, Pimien Pancanka, Maksim Tank, Ivan Samiakin, Vasil Bykau. Since its inception, the UBW has always been defending the Belarusan language, culture, and literature, which often led to prosecution on the part of the state.



During the years of its existence, members of our Union wrote works which, without exaggeration, became part of the gold fund and are studied today at schools and universities. Such names of UBW members as Maksim Tank and Ivan Mielez, Vasil Bykau and Ivan Samiakin, Janka Bryl and Uladzimir Karatkievic, Ales Adamovic and Nil Hilevic, Ryhor Baradulin and Hienadz Buraukin, Ivan Ptasnikau and Michas Stralcou, and many others are well-known in the world.



In the 1980s, during Perestroika and Glasnost, UBW members headed the national independence movement and in 1994, when democratic transformations were stopped and attacks on the Belarusan language and culture began, UBW members battled against the establishment of dictatorship in the country, for the freedom of speech and thought, and were punished again. In 1996, according to the Belarusan president's order, the Writers' House that belonged to the UBW was expropriated; in 2002 - all editions that were founded by the UBW were expropriated, too. In 2005, the state-run union of writers - the Union of Writers of Belarus - was created. The newly created union was given the premises of our former House and the editions that belonged to the UBW. Thus, the state divided writers in "our authors" and "not our authors" - this divide was caused not by creative principles, but by loyalty to the existing authorities.

In 2006 and in 2010, the state and the pro-state union made attempts to liquidate our organization, and only thanks to international support and solidarity of literary organizations of Europe we managed to preserve our Union and to avoid liquidation. However, prosecutions of members of our organization continue. There are so-called "black lists" of writers whose works and books are forbidden and cannot be published in state-run publishing houses and editions and whose meetings with readers in libraries and educational institutions are banned.



Today the UBW has 467 members - 332 male writers and 135 female writers, including all the most famous in Belarus and abroad - Anatol Viarcinski, Ales Razanau, Rajisa Baravikova, Uladzimir Niaklajeu, Svetlana Alexievich, Uladzimir Arlou, and others, as well as the most talented Belarusan authors of middle and younger generations. Their creativities cover all known kinds of literature: poetry, prose, dramatic art, translations, works for children, as well as essays, documentaries, and scientific researches. The organization has a non-fiction section and the Ukrainian Literature Association.

Books of members of our organization are translated into various languages of the world. Belarusan writers have recently become winners of many prestigious international awards, and Svetlana Alexievich received the Nobel Prize in 2015.

We work for the sake of writers, teachers, young people who study, readers, fans of literature, creative youth, publishers, book sellers, and experts.

The UBW is a member of the European Literary Council, the Council of the Association of Baltic Literary Unions. The Dziejaslou Magazine published by the UBW is included in the European network of cultural magazines "Eurozine". In 2015, the UBW received the award "Heroes of Copyright" of the Swedish administrative center of copyrights in the branch of literature ALIS.

The UBW's administrative activity is provided by the Secretariat (chairperson and vice-chairperson), the Council, the enrolment board and the auditing commission, as well as chairpersons of five regional branches.

FOR THE FREEDOM OF SPEECH, THOUGHT AND STATEMENTS

During 2017, the UBW accepted several tens of open statements concerning questions topical in the country, including those with the purposes of defending rights of writers, of celebrating the cultural heritage, of expanding the sphere of use of the Belarusan language and literature.

When in February 2017 the Belarusan law enforcement bodies detained the well-known Ukrainian writer Serhiy Zhadan who had come to take part in the 6th international poetic festival "Poems On Asphalt" dedicated to the memory of Michas Stralcou, thanks to joint efforts of public organizations the decision on his deportation within 72 hours was cancelled and the creator successfully performed in Minsk.



In March 2017, at the 17th congress of the Union of Belarusan Writers, the resolution and statements "Concerning the 500th anniversary of Belarusan book publishing", "Concerning the exception of the UBW from the list of creative unions", and "Concerning the situation with literary museums" were accepted.

As a result of the open appeal to the highest state structures and the wide public discussion, the UBW restored its status of a creative union and members of the organization were freed from the so-called "tax on social parasitism".

The UBW publicly condemned the arrests within the "Patriots Case", made a statement to protect the poet Uladzimir Niaklajeu in court, and expressed its opinion in connection with the fact that lawyer Hanna Bachcina had been deprived of her activity license.

Nadzieja Kandrusievic, translator:

"The "Color Bicycle" series supported by the UBW was created to publish children's literature in Belarusan. The series publishes books of Belarusan authors, as well as books of Swedish children's writers translated into Belarusan. The children's book is the first meeting of a child with literature and art; therefore, the edition of quality books for children is very important. It is possible to see kids' interest in reading during presentations of published books. This year, the series issued the book of Gunilla Bergstrom about Bill and Bolla, which concerns the problem of distinction and our attitude to people who differ. All translations and projects I'm engaged in are very important to me and I'm very grateful to the UBW for its support and help in their implementation".

Regional almanacs that present creativity of writers from regions are published every year: the Brest, Viciebsk, Homiel, Hrodna, and Mahilou Regions.

The UBW organizes **performances of independent creators** in Minsk and regions. During 2017, there were more than 400 presentations of new books, creative meetings all across Belarus with participation of more than 1,870 speakers and more than 23,805 spectators. Libraries, educational institutions, the courses "Mova Nanova" were given thousands of books.

The UBW pays much attention to the preservation of the memory about writers, cares of the cultural heritage, and celebrates anniversaries of well-known writers.

In 2017, the organization carried out events to the memory of poets and representatives of the intelligentzia who were repressed in Soviet Belarus in the 1930s.



The literary and art magazine "Dziejaslou" (www.dziejaslou.by) **celebrated its 15th anniversary** with a large-scale flashmob event in the Internet and a big concert with participation of tens of writers and musicians.

PUBLIC CAMPAIGNS



In 2017, the Union of Belarusan Writers together with the public cultural campaign "Budzma [Let's Be] Belarusans!" organized the action "500 Years" in honor of the **500th anniversary of Belarusan** book publishing. All across the country, in cities and towns, there were hundreds of educational meetings, lectures, and presentations attended by thousands of people.

LITERARY AWARDS

The Jerzy Giedroyc Literary Award is awarded annually for the best book written in the Belarusan language in the genres of "narrative literature" and "essayistics". The organizers of this contest are the Belarusan PEN center, Poland's Embassy to the Republic of Belarus, the Polish Institute in Minsk; the sponsors of the awards are the Idea Bank and the charitable foundation "Returning". In 2017, the winners are Zmicier Bartosik (1st place), Ludmila Rubleuskaia (2nd place), Adam Hlobus (3rd place). Awards for the second and third places - creative grants to visit Gotland (Sweden) and the edition of books – are presented by the UBW.



The Alexander and Maria Stahanovics Award is awarded for books written in Belarus in the Belarusan language in 2011-2014 in the field of documentary literature in the following genres: memoirs, memories, diaries, epistolary heritage (not only one's own, but also publications of other people's); biographies; travelers' notes). The partners are the Belarusan Institute of Science and Art, the Union of Belarusan Writers, the International Public Society "Belarusans' World Association "Backauscyna" ("Homeland"), the publishing house "Limarius". In 2017, the winners are Zmicier Bartosik (1st place), Vitaut Kipiel (2nd place), Siarhiei Cyhryn (3rd place).

Natalla Hardzijenka, archivist, scientist, head of the non-fiction section of the UBW:

"Any awards, state-run or private, promote literature development; therefore, the more different awards there are - the better. The Alexander and Maria Stahanovics Award is important as it became the first specialized award for works written in the non-fiction field. For many a long day, this kind of literature in Belarus was perceived as something secondary. The Stahanovics Award allowed us to draw society's attention to non-fiction literature, which popularization was then spurred by Svetlana Alexievich's Nobel Prize.

The Stahanovics Award bears the name of emigration figures and is funded by an emigrant, thus symbolizing a sui generis union of Belarusan literature abroad and Belarusan literature in Belarus."

is organized by the Union of Belarusan Writers, the Belarusan PEN center, and the charitable foundation "Returning". In 2017, Andrei Chadanovic was awarded as the best translator for the book of Charles Baudelaire's poetry published in the series "Poets of the Planet".

The literary award "Debut" named after Maksim Bahdanovic was founded in 2010 by the Belarusan PEN center, the charitable foundation "Returning", and the Union of Belarusan Writers. It is awarded for a debut book to authors up to 35 years old for works in the genres in which Maksim Bahdanovic worked: poetry, prose, and literary translation. In 2017, the winners are Michal Baranouski (poetry), Andrus Horvat (prose), and Adela Dubaviec (literary translation).

The award named after Ciotka (Alajiza Paskievic) for the best book for children and teenagers was founded by the UBW, the Belarusan PEN center, and the charitable foundation "Returning" in 2015. The award is awarded in two nominations: for the best work for children and teenagers (irrespective of a literature kind - prose, poetry, dramatic art - to the author of an original Belarusan book) and for the best decorating of the book (the illustrator of the book). In 2017, the writer Uladzimir Arlou and the artist Paviel Tatarnikau were awarded for the book "Homeland - Colorful History".

The literary award named after Natalla Arsiennieva for the best poetic book was based in 2017 by the Orsa-Romano Culture and Education Foundation and the Charitable Foundation of the Association of the Belarusans in Great Britain. The co-founders of the award are the Union of Belarusan Writers, the Belarusan PEN center, and the IPS BWA «Backauscyna» («Homeland»).

The "Golden Apostrophe" Literary Award for the best publication in the "Dziejaslou" magazine in 2017 was awarded for the 14th time. It was awarded to Kryscina Banduryna (debut), Valer Hapiejeu (prose), and Michas Skobla (poetry).

The annual Belarusan-Ukrainian literary award "Soldier of Light" named after Michas Zyznieuski was based by the UBW and the National Union of Writers of Ukraine in the summer of 2015. In 2017, the winner is Michas Skobla for his essays book "Sarcophagi of Fear".

Zmicier Bartosik, writer, winner of three awards in 2017:

"If I say that literary awards are not the main thing for a real writer, it won't be something new. After all, books are written, of course, not for the sake of awards. Still, awards are a necessary thing. They spur people's interest. People who, thanks to these awards, find out that – as it appears in Belarus there are authors! who write on such topics! Any award always draws attention of the mass media. Not a literary workshop, not an evening to the memory of a writer. But an award. And even a simple list of nominees spurs readers' appetite. And there must be more awards."

FESTIVALS

The annual international poetic festival to the memory of Michas Stralcou "Poems On Asphalt" was founded in 2012 by the UBW and the Belarusan PEN center. In different years, poets from Belarus, Germany, Iceland, Kazakhstan, Lithuania, Latvia, Norway, Poland, Russia, Slovakia, Ukraine, Sweden, Finland, and Estonia were participants of this festival. Among traditional actions/events of the festival, there are poetic



slams, literary readings, discussions, presentations of books and book series, musical performances, etc. In 2017, the festival was dedicated to the 80th anniversary of Michas Stralcou; it lasted three days on three platforms and united poets, translators, and musicians from Belarus, Lithuania, Czech Republic, Sweden, Ukraine, Poland, and Russia.

In 2017, the UBW founded the literary festival "Sign of Equality" aimed at actualizing the activity of the creators who are often pushed to the periphery of the Belarusan literary process. The three-day program of the festival suggested to address to the female presence in the present and the past of Belarusan literature and theater, to give Belarusan female writers a chance to share opinions, to voice the literary experience of regional authors, and to discuss features of the literary life outside the limits of the capital, as well as to view the basic ways of speaking about otherness in children's literature.

Volha Hapieieva, poetess, translator, scientist, participant of the Sign Of Equality Festival:

"In spite of the fact that gender equality questions are mentioned more and more in the public sphere of our country, a lot of points of this sphere still remain little-known or are ignored absolutely. Therefore, the carrying-out of a separate festival, which would place emphasis on equality problems (not only those of a gender character), is a topical and necessary thing. I agreed with pleasure to carry out a discussion within the framework of the Sign Of Equality Festival, which Belarusan and foreign she-writers took part in. The problems discussed during this discussion showed that questions of discrimination of women in literature are still topical and that they concern Belarus, Norway, and Sweden. It would be good if this festival were annual."

The annual literary-musical festival "Indian Summer" to the memory of Nina Macias takes place in Bielaaziorsk (the Brest Voblasc [Region]) where lived the well-known poetess, translator, public figure, foundress of the regional almanac "Chandelier" ["Zyrandola"], head of the Brest regional branch of the UBW. It is carried out in the local Palace of Culture and unites fans of Nina Macias' creativity, her friends and colleagues.

The Belarusan-Polish literary workshop "Biazmiezza" is carried out annually in the Bialystok Region; it is organized by the creative intelligentzia of Podlachia: Jauhien Vapa, head of "Radio Racyja", the weekly journal "Niva" from Bialystok, and the UBW. Its three-day program includes literary readings, presentations of new books, discussions, musical performances, ceremonies of awarding winners of local literary contests for those who write in the Belarusan language.

The annual poetic festival to the honor of Anatol Sys is carried out in the poet's native village of Haroskau, the Recyca Rajon [District], and unites fans of poetry, his friends, and fans of his creativity.

YOUNG WRITERS' SCHOOL

The school has been working since 2012 as an informal educational project.

The work form: practical classes in prose with constant teachers, lectures and master classes of invited scientists and authors.

In 2017, the Young Writers' School was **attended by 20 new male and female students**. The contest was more than 4 people for a place (82 applications, 20 selected). For 5 years, more than 80 people studied at the YWS.

Following the results of each academic year, a collection of YWS graduates' works is published.

CONTESTS

The annual **contest for young authors "Exlibris"** has a new topic every year. In 2017, the contest was named after Francysk Skaryna and dated to the 500th anniversary of Belarusan publishing; it was dedicated to translations into the Belarusan language. 5 young translators became winners of the contest.

INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION

Books From Belarus

The non-commercial project Books From Belarus (www.booksfrombelarus.net) is aimed at presenting and advancing the best works of contemporary Belarusan literature abroad, at building contacts with foreign publishing houses, and at promoting the translation of books into various languages. In 2017, Belarusan writers took part in book fairs in Bialystok, Lviv, and Frankfurt. Two books of prose by Alena Brava and Barys Piatrovic translated into the Polish language were published and presented in Bialystok. The translation of the book of essays by Tacciana Skarynkina received the award PEN Translates of the English PEN center. During the 6th Open Eurasian Book Forum and Literature Festival in Stockholm, Hanna Komar's debut poetic book "Fear of Height" from the UBW series "Starting Point" received the award named after Marzia Zakiryanava; it will be translated into English and published in Great Britain.

EWC

In the summer of 2017, Belarus was chosen to carry out the EWC – the General Assembly of the European Literary Council. The UBW is a member of the Council and will accept guests of honor. The event will happen in Minsk in June 2018.



In 2017, the UBW announced the creation of the **grant named after Magdalena Radzivil for female writers and translators** and mentioned the names of those who received it.

The grant is given for creative work; it will be awarded once per year. The age of female authors nominated for it is not limited.

This year, it was given to Tacciana Barysik (Mahilou), Alena Brava (Barysau), and Darja Lis (Smarhon).

The creative grant to the Writers' House on Gotland (Sweden) of the Swedish Union of Writers is given by the Union of Belarusan Writers to four authors every year.

The **residence of young writers** is supported by the UBW, the Belarusan PEN center, and the Belarusan house of human rights in Vilnius.

The program allows creators up to 35 years old to live in the House of human

rights in Vilnius for two weeks and to be engaged in literary work (poetry, prose, translations, criticism, etc.).

WORKSHOPS AND PROTECTION OF AUTHORS' RIGHTS

In order to increase authors' competences, in 2016-2017, the UBW together with the Kamunikat Library (www.kamunikat.org) organized a **series of lectures and workshops on copyright protection** in regional cities and Minsk.

The UBW lawyer Volha Siamaska conducted practical lessons for all who were interested in the basic rights of writers. Following the results of this series of lectures, we prepared and published a book on copyrights that has paper and electronic versions and can be downloaded free-of-charge on the UBW web-site lit-bel.org.



The organization's web-site has a separate section - "About authors' rights" dedicated to the corresponding subjects. There are our legal consultations. UBW members can ask their questions concerning the implementation and protection of their copyrights via email: law@lit-bel.org.



Volha Siamaska, lawyer of the Union of Belarusan Writers:

"Possession of copyright basics is a sui generis engine that allows authors to offer their works to a wide circle of readers and to receive an adequate reward of their creative work or to refuse it. Ideally, the question "Is it possible to live exclusively thanks to the benefits of literary work?" should answered in the affirmative.

UBW members want to know their own rights; therefore, every month there are questions concerning legal aspects of creation, distribution, and cession of rights to use literary works, as well as pictures, works of art, articles and interviews in the mass media."

GENDER EQUALITY



In February 2017, the series "Writers' Bookshop" issued a unique **anthology of female poetry of the interbellum** (1917-1941) "Lightning Strokes" compiled by Aksana Danilcyk and Viktar Zybul, UBW members, philologists-scientists. Thanks to this anthology, readers' wide circles, as well as researchers of literature, opened for the first time tens of names of forgotten poetesses of the 1920s-1930s.

The UBW Secretariat and management organized and carried out a one-day workshop on gender equality with participation of the expert in the field of gender from Sweden Vani Hermele. The workshop took place in Minsk at the UBW office on April, 21st, 2017.

Besides, we founded the **grant named after Magdalena Radzivil** for female writers and translators and carried out for the first time the three-day festival "Sign of Equality" dedicated to the discussion of gender problematics.

Alena Brava, author:

"An extremely important event for Belarusan authoresses and she-translators, I think, is that the UBW founded the grant named after Magdalena Radzivil. I'm proud that this year the Council of the grant headed by Svetlana Alexievich has chosen me to be one of three winners. It is known quite well that today it is more difficult for Belarusan penwomen than for men to implement and legitimatize their right to creativity. Many talented girls, who began perfectly, stop writing because they have no time for literature - they have to work to earn some money; there are household chores that under our conditions remain mainly females' duty; all these do not allow them to concentrate, which is needed for writing. And when your ardent battle against household activities for the sake of life is evaluated and supported by well-known people, it is such a pleasure. You can allow yourself to concentrate on creative work - what else does the writer need? The grant named after Magdalena Radzivil will help our authoresses feel more free and enrich Belarusan literature with new poetry, prose, and translations."
